#### 2.1 Overview

#### 2.2 Purpose

The purpose of the project website is to provide a central point of communication, dissemination, and exploitation of the research that will be carried out of the course of the project.

#### 2.3 Structure

Upon accessing the website users will be presented with the home page, which provides an overview of the IVORY Project and access to the sub-pages; About, Partners, Research Topics, Recruitment, and News (via the navigation bar at the top of the page). A project website map can be found at the end of this document.

#### 2.3.1 Home page

The home page is divided into five sections:

- 1. Introduction to the project
- 2. News slider which displays the ten most recent news items added to the site
- 3. Doctoral candidate slider which introduces the research topics each of the doctoral candidates will cover
- 4. Project partners map covering the academic, non-academic, and secondment partners
- 5. Doctoral supervisors section that introduces the supervisors for the doctoral candidates. With the photos of each supervisor linking to their LinkedIn or academic page



#### 2.3.2 About

The About page provides the next level of detail on the project, with three sections:

- 1. Introduction to the project
- 2. Project objectives
- 3. Project methodology





#### 2.3.3 Partners

The Partners page provides the logo, name, and a summary of each of the project partners. With the partner logos linking to the partner websites.



#### 2.3.4 Research Topics

The Research Topics page provides an overview of all the research topics and enables users to access each of the Doctoral Candidate pages.



#### 2.3.4.1 Doctoral Candiate pages 1 to 15

The Doctoral Candidate pages provide details on the hosts, objective, expected results and planned secondments for each research topic.





#### 2.3.5 Recruitment

The Recruitment page provides details on how people can apply to become a Doctoral Candidate. The page provides sections on Industrial doctorates PhD trajectory, Eligibility criteria, Financial aspects, Application process, and the PhD positions — with associated links to the vacancies (hosted on the academic partners websites).



#### 2.3.6 News

The News page provides access to all the news items on the project website.



#### 2.4 Perspectives

The plan is for the website to grow over the course of the project.

In particular each of the Doctoral Candidates will take ownership of their relevant Doctoral Candidate page, with each of the pages becoming a showcase for their research, papers, publications, and other associated content.

At the end of the project, it is intended to merge the project webs-site with the Learning Management System (LMS) that will be developed within WP2 of IVORY, so that training material and resources used in IVORY can made available on-line.

Therefore, the website will grow into (a significant part of) the sustainable learning and networking platform that is envisaged to be available also after the end of the project.
